



New York State Good Guardianship Act Introduced

Our Guardianship Access New York coalition (GANY) has announced the introduction of the New York State Good Guardianship Act, landmark legislation designed to modernize and strengthen New York State's Article 81 guardianship system. Sponsored by Senator Cordell Cleare, Chair of the Senate Aging Committee, and Assemblymember Charles Lavine, Chair of the Assembly Judiciary Committee, the bill directly advances a high-priority recommendation of the New York State Master Plan for Aging.

If passed, this legislation would expand access to qualified nonprofit guardians, strengthen oversight and accountability, and address chronic underfunding that leaves thousands of vulnerable New Yorkers—primarily older adults and people with disabilities—without needed protection and support. Backed by research showing that a \$15 million investment could generate \$85 million in net savings, GANY members are urging lawmakers to pass the bill and include funding in the state fiscal year 2027 budget to build a more equitable, person-centered guardianship system statewide.

PG Testifies at Hearing on Preventing Fraud Against Older Adults

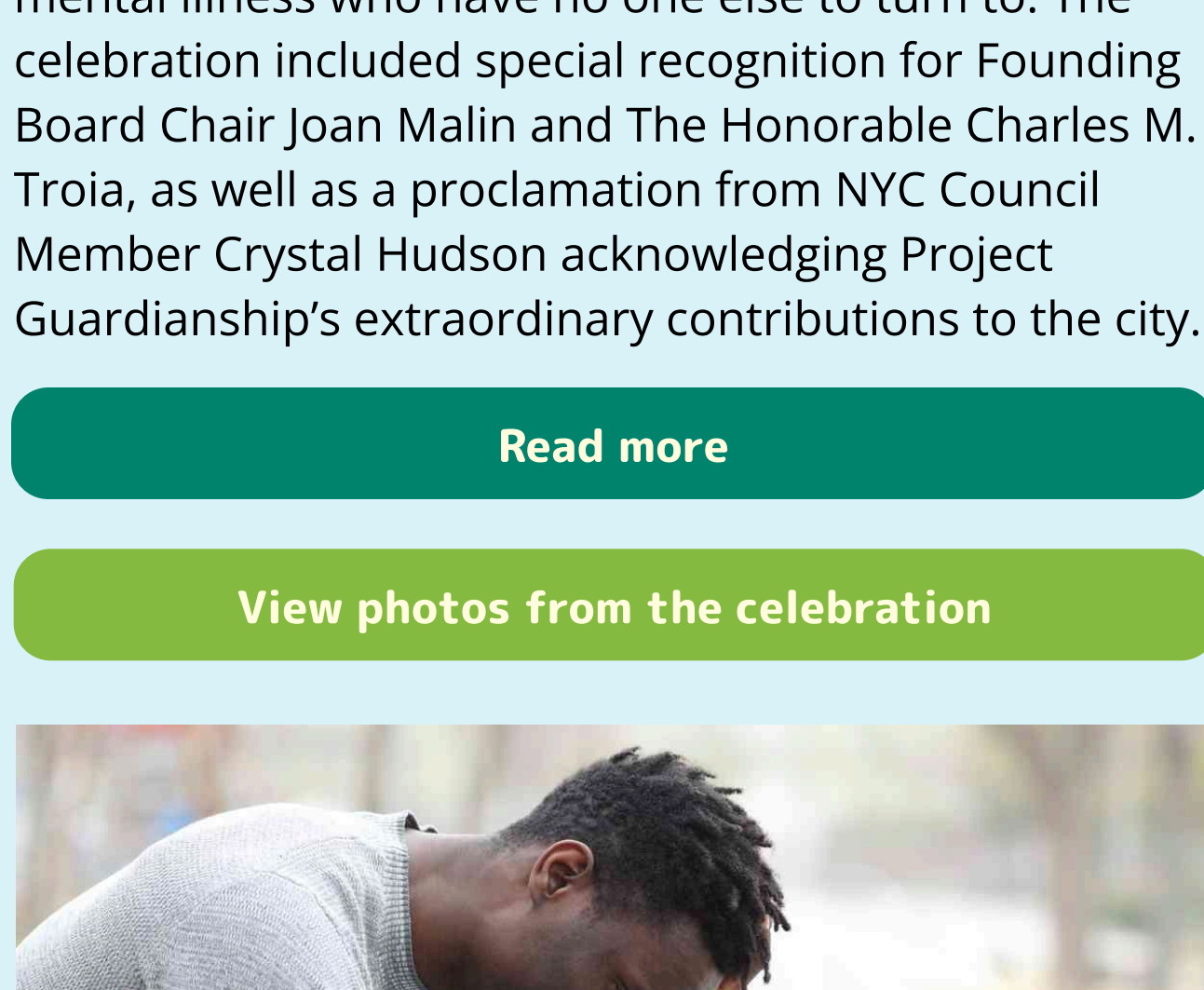
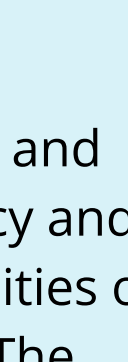
Kimberly George, President and CEO of Project Guardianship, testified before the New York State Assembly at a hearing on Adult Protective Services and elder financial exploitation.

In her testimony, she explained how financial abuse of older adults often leads to guardianship as a last-resort safety net. Using a real case, she demonstrated how guardianship protected a vulnerable older New Yorker and outlined a growing statewide crisis: New York does not have enough qualified guardians for courts to appoint.

She closed with a call for the State to invest \$15 million in a statewide network of nonprofit guardianship providers to ensure access to protection, improve outcomes, prevent unnecessary institutionalization, create jobs, and save the State tens of millions of dollars each year.

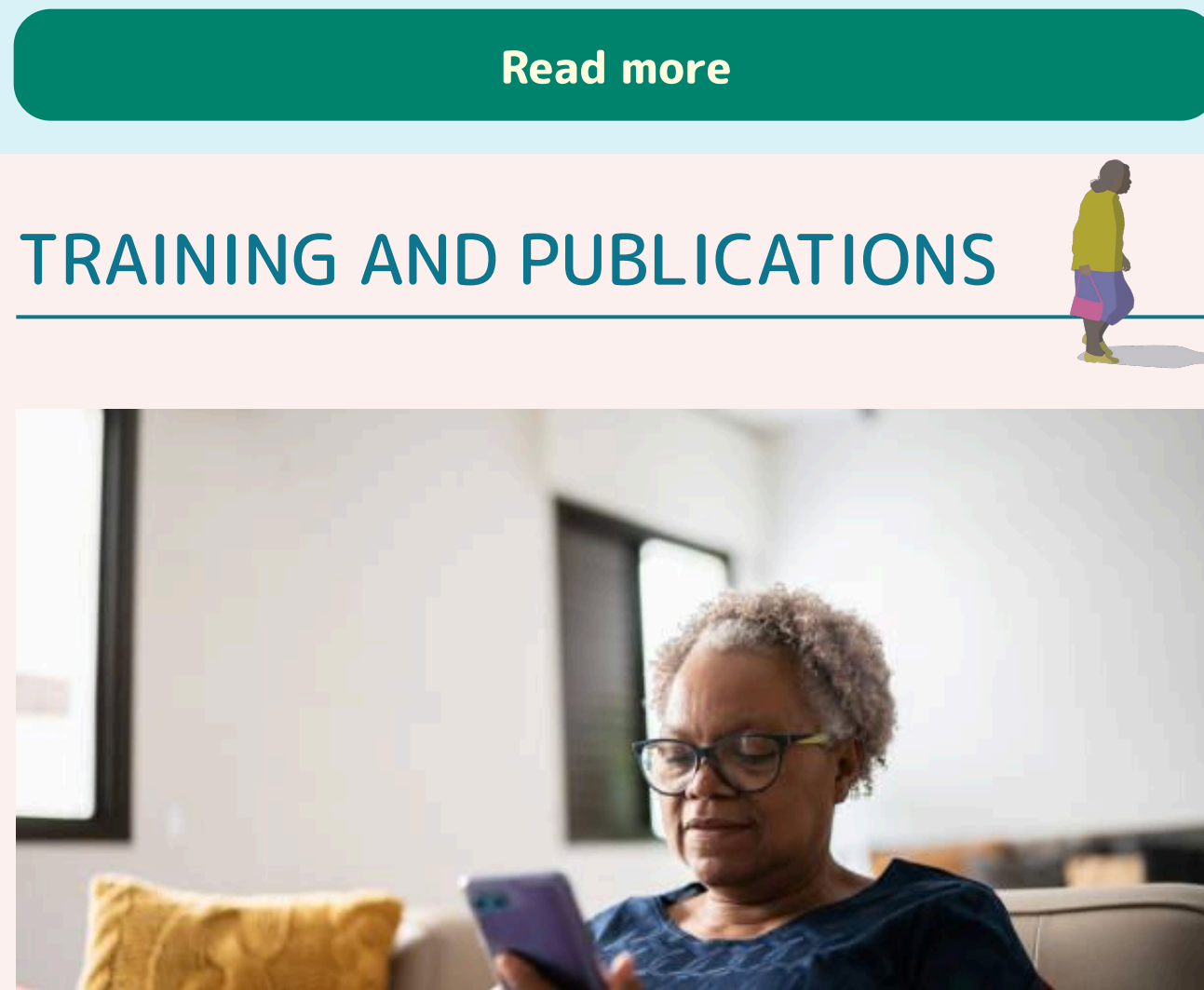
MOMENTUM AND MILESTONES
